NMSZ Data Development update	Matt Gerike gave an update on the status of data development. 35 of the 49 data layers are completed. See handouts for specific details. Mostly Madison and Wayne Counties are left. They have begun trying to identify structure type while collection point data. They are using a list of 13-15 building types for this. Structures	Mark Duewell gave an update of the structures projects being completed through MU. He is working on a project for Central Missouri, the Mid-MO RPC out of Ashland. They will do data review using USGS funding through the stewardship portion of the project.	
Broadband Mapping	<p>MU is working on collecting community access points for 11 data layers. State facilities have been completed. The first version (validate/verifying) should be completed May 31st. After this, they will monitor/maintain this data.</p> <p>Data layers:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> correctional facilities courthouses public libraries colleges & universities public schools military forts & bases national guard fire departments law enforcement hospitals public health 	
Mapbooks	Funding is on hold for Statewide Mapbook project through National Guard. COL Reichman addressed this issue by saying that this is too big of a project for the National Guard to fund. NGA has products for the National Guard, and are working on a mapbook for flooding along the MO and MISS rivers. Books will contain imagery on one side, and roads on the other, along with critical infrastructure at 1:4000 scale. Mapbooks can be created by NGA in one to	

	<p>two weeks time.</p> <p>Tim Haithcoat will set up a meeting with Paul Fennewald to get HS money to complete mapbooks.</p> <p>We are looking at July for USNG training. Will keep everyone posted when dates are available.</p>	
<p>Other Activities</p>	<p>SEMA and National Guard grounds have been reserved for July 8-9th for USNG training. However, Delta State is not sure funding is still available through St. Louis program as previously stated. May just use local instructors if they are not available. Once this is cleared up, training enrollment will be available through SEMA training website.</p> <p>Ray – USGS is working with FEMA to finish out counties, as FEMA only creates data for the floodplain.</p> <p>Tim - State Homeland Security funding has been released. Money for GIS servers was included. He would like to find a Department of Ag representative to attend this HS GIS meeting. He attended a Homeland Security workshop at the NSGIC meeting. In HSIP data production and partnerships, he talked about the importance of using local government to finish out data development and to maintain the data. He would like to take ownership of the MO Disaster portal to get it moving along. He will contact the web presence group about this.</p> <p>Brett – Cloud ArcGIS Server will be available soon. Flex will be getting a new face that includes web editing with Flex 4 and Flash 10. The public beta version is available now, but must have ArcGIS Server 10.</p> <p>Alexis – The Risk Management Project is completed. Over 700 geopdf's were delivered to local agencies on DVDs. This project maps the EPA's RMP chemical sites, worst case scenario buffers, and critical facilities in those buffers, and provides various reports for each site and county. Center for Emergency Response and Terrorism has a new Director, Melissa Friel who comes from the Red Cross. Alexis has met with her about GIS needs in CERT. No wave of H1N1 as predicted.</p> <p>Jeremiah – He will be sending out an introductory email to the HS group. He can telecom or webinar the briefs if anyone is</p>	

	<p>interested.</p> <p>COL Reichman – ICAV has integrated civil air patrol information imagery/photos. For ICAV access, contact Jeremiah Steele.</p> <p>Debbie – Saw a demo on the updated VIPER application. Lots of new features including secure login, road surface temperatures, traffic flow with current MPH of traffic, and live dispatch. She has requested the code from Virginia.</p>
