<b>GENERAL BUSINESS</b>		
<b>Presentation - IICD</b>	Sean Dolan, from DHS Infrastructure Information Collection Division, gave a presentation on the newly developed Data Exchange Partnership (DEP) program. The slides can be viewed on the HS website. The program is new, and a lot of the details are still to be worked out. Currently there is no funding that would be provided for this, and DHS will have no ownership of the data. It will be a non-restricted dataset, and the data should be available to state and local partners. They hope to have USGS as a partner, and are not sure yet how this program will relate to HSIP. There will be no QA/QC on the data at the federal level.	Presentation is available on HS website.
<b>NMSZ Data Development update</b>	Matt Gerike gave an update on the status of data development. Wayne County roads should be completed today. A status update of all the layers was handed out and is available on the HS website. Topo maps – 75 maps have been completed, covering 5 counties. They are using best-available data for the outlying states. They are thinking of creating an image file to help with loading these into SDE. The annotation layers will be put up on the MU GRC ftp site.	Status update is available on HS website.  Matt will post the annotation layers for the topo maps on his ftp site for download.
<b>Structures</b>	Mark Duewell gave an update of the structures projects being completed through MU. He is working on a project for Central Missouri, the Mid-MO RPC out of Ashland. They will do data review using USGS funding.  Several RSOCs are requesting HS funding to support similar projects. This RPC could consider this.	
<b>Broadband Mapping</b>	Matt gave an update on the Broadband mapping project since Tim Haithcoat was unavailable. MU is working on collecting community access points for 11 data layers. They will be verifying the location of each facility and if broadband is available. They are still trying to get State Office buildings. These are supposed to be completed by April 30 <sup>th</sup> .	Matt will send list of 11 layers to Debbie.

<b>Mapping Standards – symbology / mapbooks</b>	<p>Draft symbology has been created for mapbooks. This and dataset has been sent to Delta State. Comments of sample maps: Brett has road symbology that works well for color blind. He will forward. Need to consider the look of the maps if printed in grayscale. It is hard to see the USNG on the imagery. Add the roads to the imagery map. Additional comments will be accepted, email to Debbie. Delta State will be working up one county sample, and this will be sent out to everyone for review and comments.</p> <p>We are looking at July for USNG training. <b>Other Activities</b>	<p>Ray is attending a data call for the FEMA RiskMap program. He will send Debbie any news about this.</p> <p>Jeremiah is looking into bringing up the Corp of Engineer's Silver Jacket program for Missouri. This program brings together multiple agencies to reduce risks associated with flooding and other natural disasters.</p> <p>Brett was on the NWS call this morning, and they are predicting the Mississippi River to flood above 2008 levels down to Clarksville.</p> <p>All the NWS links will be changing around April 1.</p> <p>Ray has a new website: <a href="http://liaisons.usgs.gov/geospatial/Missouri/">http://liaisons.usgs.gov/geospatial/Missouri/</a></p> <p>David is working with the Dam Safety group at DNR. They have point data and pipeline data.
