Mapping Standards	Renee Robinson is working on creating a draft for this, but was not available to give an update.	
USNG	<p>Wide Area Search training is being conducted by the Boone County Fire Department on October 30th. They are working on Geospatial standards for this, and will be testing them at this training. Debbie has been working with them on this, and will help develop standards for use with any field search team. USNG is being used for this.</p> <p>Suggested that Talbot Brooks give a presentation at the MAGIC symposium for USNG.</p>	Rich would like to be included in the standards development.
Regional Data Collection	<p>Nathan continues to work with Region F on data consolidation. Concerns have been raised about data sharing, and the fear that a consolidated database at SEMA could be open to Sunshine Requests. They are working on a data sharing agreement that could prevent this.</p> <p>Nathan gave an update of data creation of the bootheel area. All but streams in phase 1 (10 counties) is complete. Should be done by next month. Phase II (6 counties) is underway.</p>	
Other	<p>H1N1 update – Alexis Week 40, status is now “widespread”. 4 outbreaks and 4 schools closed. Creating daily maps. HTML map with flu clinics is now available on the DHSS website, and is updated weekly.</p> <p>Ray is needing the structures data and is waiting to hear from the GIO or SEMA on if</p>
