<b>UPDATES</b>		
<b>HSAC meeting</b>	<p>Debbie gave a brief demonstration of the GIS web viewer now at SEMA. It went very well and was well received.</p> <p>Geospatial Investment Justification was added to list of possible items that RHSOC can spend against. This is the first time that that has happened. Opens up the \$4.4 million to possibly being spent on geospatial.</p> <p>State appropriated \$100,000 to continue work on data development in the NMSZ</p> <p>David Finch has \$155,000 allocated to 'integrate GIS with MERIS'.</p> <p>In RHSOC meeting both Mark James (Director of Public Safety) and Paul Fennewald (Director of Homeland Security) mentioned that GIS would be a good area for the regions to invest and collaborate in.</p>	We need to be at the table for these discussions to provide guidance.
<b>CI/KR meeting</b>	<p>The CI/KR committee is creating a new strategic plan using Virginia as a model. There is potential to add GIS as integrated element of the State CI/KR Strategic Plan</p> <p>Tim Haithcoat and Debbie are leads with Paul from Region I on the team to develop the data portion of the document.</p>	
<b>USGS Alliance for 1:24K mapping and database development for NMSZ</b>	No update.	
<b>HSIP</b>	A new web tool has been rolled out to access the HSIP dataset. Need to know what data will be available and what their update process is.	
<b>Project Homeland</b>	<p>ArcGIS Server is up and running on SEMA private network. Working on connections for Internet access.</p> <p>Debbie will give a demonstration of the new web viewer for National Guard on September 26.</p>
