Statewide Mapbooks	<p>To be called Disaster Support Atlas, unless someone has some other idea.</p> <p>20 counties complete so far. Geopdfs are by county and are about 1.3 Gig each. Ray looked into serving these on the USGS server, but they will not work for that. He will check with EROS to see if they could be served out there. Discussed having county pdfs created that are not geo-enabled that could be downloaded and printed (file size about 300 mb) and having geopdfs transferred via portable hard drives.</p> <p>MXDs for each county will be available for any local agency that wants to customize the mapbooks. They will be in 9.3.</p> <p>Renee is working on training documentation for the Geopdf. Debbie has created a ppt for USNG Basics. We should create a ppt for the Mapbooks.</p>	
Homeland Security Initiatives	<p>Need to set initiatives for MGISAC Strategic Plan and for HSAC quarterly reporting. Some items include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Creation and promotion of USNG Atlas for all counties in Missouri -Continued support of HSIP program -Coordination for 2011 earthquake exercise -Increase participation from local and regional GIS professionals. <p>Jeremiah spoke about HSIN Connect. Includes free online web conferencing service. Works well for low bandwidth. May be tools on interest for our group. MARC has set up a Community of Interest and a Sub-COI for GIS.</p>	
MoGIS Conference	<p>Conference is February 14-16th 2011. There will be a 4 hour workshop on USNG put on by Boone County and SEMA. Abstracts and posters are now being accepted for the program. Possible topics discussed included Mapbook mxd program discussion, risk management, qa/qc and GIS inventory project.</p>	

NMSZ update	Tim gave an update on data development. Most layers are ready to load, just finishing up forest cover. Data will be delivered to SEMA this week. Have learned a lot along the way in this project and have modified work processes along the way. They are now tagging for type of structure.	
Broadband	On second round of data collection. Held a technology conference that had breakout for emergency management.	
Structures	Region A is complete and Tim will meet with Debbie and Mark Allen for final delivery. Mark - Warren, Lincoln, Montgomery have qa/qc data complete. This needs to be incorporated into the Statewide data. Central Missouri RPC is currently working on QA/QC of critical infrastructure data.	
Other Activities	<p>Earthquake Exercise – May 2011. SEMA is using GIS in planning for exercise. Secure Internet site allows planners to edit damages for facilities and add incidents. NGA is creating mapbooks for this. Kim will see if it will be available for State/Local use.</p> <p>National Guard will be opening a public site that will allow approved agencies to consume AGS services. She is hopeful to have it up and working before the Eq exercise. Renee will be attending the National Guard's IT conference in December. This is the first time there has been a tract for GIS.</p>
